Service user or public involvement is essential in research production and can increase the breadth of knowledge, experience and skills within the research team ((NiHR, 2019)


Step 1: The Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) released new standards for the education of nurses for children and young people. Some of which pertained to service user engagement. There were 2 specific standards that we took for discussion with YPAGne:

1.12: "Ensure programmes are designed, delivered, evaluated and co-produced with service users"

2.7: "Ensure that service users and representatives from relevant stakeholder groups are engaged in partnership in student recruitment and selection" NMC, 2018

Project Design:

Based on an ideas from YPAG the following project is proposed: Children in 2 existing community groups, to work on "Britain's Got The Best Children's Nurses" making a short scene showing a patient receiving what they believe is the best care. Participants will then peer review their films and comment on key aspects of care. This will be audio recorded for thematic analysis by research team.

Study aims:

- To work in partnership with YPAG to ensure the voices of children and young people are visible in the recruitment and education of children's nursing students.
- To develop an understanding of nursing skills, values and attributes from the child's and young person's perspective.
- To embed service user feedback into our Children's Nursing Programme.
- To constructively and creatively address NMC requirements.
