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Professor Ashraf M. Salama

University of Strathclyde
Glasgow, UK

Professor Ashraf M. Salama (PhD, FRSA, FHEA) is Chair in Architecture and Head of the Department of Architecture at the University of Strathclyde Glasgow, UK. He holds B.Arch, M.Arch, and PhD. from the Al Azhar University in Egypt and North Carolina State University, USA (1987, 1991, 1996). He is a fellow of the Higher Education Academy-FHEA and the Royal Society of the Arts-FRSA, Affiliate Member of the Royal Institute of British Architects – RIBA, and Appointed Member of the Steering Committee of the Education Commission and Validation Council, International Union of Architects I Paris, France (2017-2020).

With wide experience in academic research, teaching, professional practice and consulting, Professor Salama was the Founding Head of the Department of Architecture and Urban Planning at Qatar University (2009-2014). Earlier, he has held permanent, tenured, and visiting positions (1996-2014) in Egypt at Misr International University and at Al-Azhar University, in Italy at University of Naples, Federico II, in Saudi Arabia at King Fahd University of Petroleum and Minerals), and in the United Kingdom at Queen's University Belfast. He is a licensed architect in Egypt since 1987 and was the Director of Research and Consulting at Adams Group Architects in Charlotte, North Carolina, United States (2001-2004). Prof. Salama is the Founding Chief Editor of ArchNet-IJAR: International Journal of Architectural Research, collaborating editor of Open House International, and editorial board member for numerous international journals. He serves on the scientific and review boards of several international organizations in North America, Europe, and South East Asia.

In 2017, Professor Salama was named the Recipient of the UIA Jean Tschumi Prize for Excellence in the Architectural Education and Criticism in recognition of his achievements in a career spanning 30 years, in which he has headed three architecture departments – two as founder – in three continents and has emerged as a worldwide authority on architectural pedagogy and the architecture of emerging cities in the Middle East. Professor Salama has published 9 books and over 170 articles and book chapters. His latest book Spatial Design Education: New Directions for Pedagogy in Architecture and Beyond is published by Routledge, and was commended by eminent scholars in Canada, Norway, United Kingdom and United States. In 2018, Professor Salama has received the Gold Medal of the Society of Egyptian Architects.

Professor Salama has lectured in more than 40 countries at various prestigious institutions including GSD-Harvard University, ETH-Swiss Federal Institute of Technology, and TUM-Technical University of Munich. His research interests and experience cross the boundaries of disciplines and involve theories and methodologies of design studio teaching in architecture and urbanism; typological transformations in traditional environments; sustainable design processes as it applies to tourist facilities, learning environments and workplaces; users-centred assessment of designed environments; adaptive urbanism and the spatial practice of migrant communities; liveability and diversity in rapidly growing contexts. In 2014, he established, and is currently leading the efforts of, CRAUCGS-Cluster for Research on Architecture and Urbanism of Cities in the Global South at the Department of Architecture, University of Strathclyde.

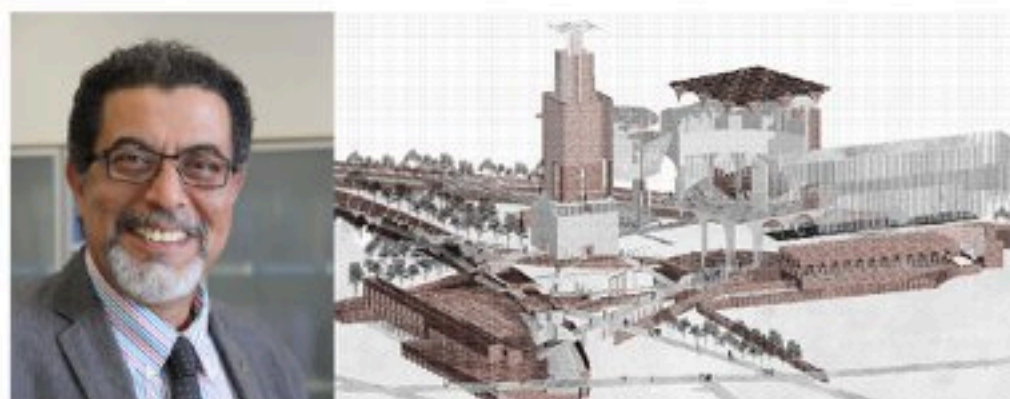

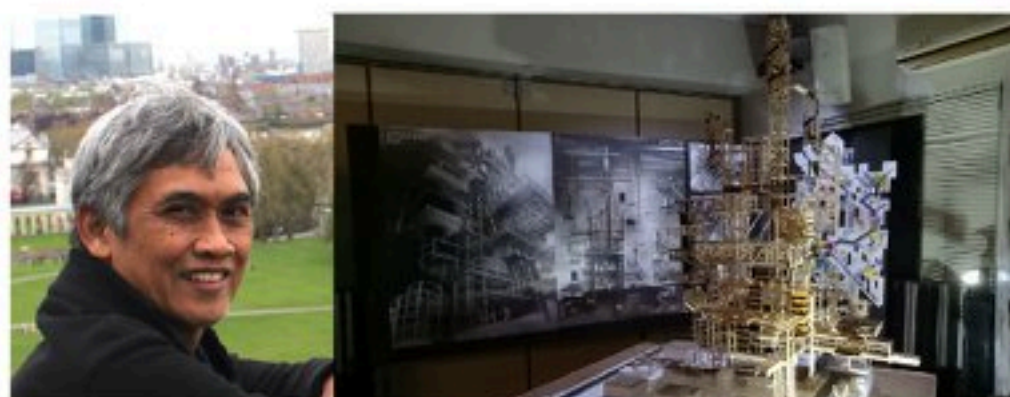

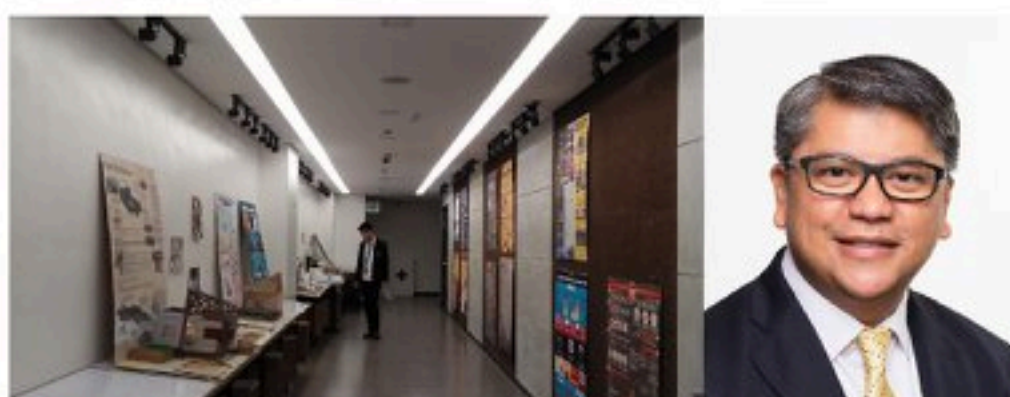
